Cele kształcenia	The aim of this course is to acquaint students with the problem of memory in international relations on the example of Japan, and to familiarize students with the post-war Japan's relations with the United States, South Korea and China, focusing primarily on the places of remembrance of World War II. At the same time, the aim of this course is to develop students' ability to analyze the impact of the historical memory events onto the contemporary international relations and regional security, with particular emphasis on the situation in Asia-Pacific region.
